Honor Societies

Art Honor Society: Ms. Melton The Art Honor Society created in 1994 is designed to recognize students with outstanding achievement in art and assist in the development of their artistic abilities.

Business & Marketing Honor Society: Mr. Ketterer and Mr. Rovello The primary purpose of the Business & Marketing Honor Society of New York State is to recognize students who have demonstrated outstanding achievement in business education at the secondary level. To become a member, students must currently be enrolled in at least one business education course and must demonstrate exemplary Character, Leadership, and Service in the classroom as well as in co-curricular and extra-curricular activities.

English Honor Society: Ms. Zeltmann The English Honor Society is dedicated to promoting love of reading and writing, and specifically focusing on these in our own community. One of our most successful programs is Reading Partners, where students work directly with elementary teachers after school, helping young students improve their reading and writing skills. We also do an annual reading assembly for kindergartners, as well as participate in many community-driven school events, like trick-or-treat street, carnivals, and the winter wonderland. All members must complete 20 hours of service and participate in at least 2 fundraisers by graduation. All students interested must have two years of unweighted 93 or better in English, and have an overall unweighted average of 85 or better. Applications are due by May 1 of the student's sophomore or junior year.

French Honor Society: Ms. Daneels The French Club/French Honor Society participates in many different activities throughout the year. Our focus is to expand cultural awareness through participation in different holiday celebrations such as Mardi Gras, Candlemas and le Poisson d'Avril. Each year we plan a different cultural trip such as Broadway shows, visiting museums and eating at authentic French restaurants. In addition, we actively participate in community service projects.

Italian Honor Society: Mr. Drucker The Italian Honor Society is involved in community service activities such as food and clothing drives. The society also provides tutoring in Italian for those students in need of assistance. Fundraising allows the society to enjoy holiday parties, welcoming and farewell parties for our exchange students, and field trips to museums, theater productions, and restaurants. Students who wish to become members of the Italian Honor Society must have a cumulative average of at least 90 in Italian and must have attended meetings and participated in various activities from the beginning of that year prior to applying for membership in March.

Math Honor Society: Ms. Danisi and Ms. Bryant NYS Math Honor Society will be working toward sponsoring a "Family Math Fun Night". High school student members will sponsor a night designed for elementary school students and their parents to engage in Math activities and events that will heighten student's awareness and interest in math. Students with an overall scholastic average of 85% and a minimum of 3 semesters of high school math with an 85% average and having good character and service can apply for admission.

National Honor Society: Ms. Holmes and Ms. Karen Verdisco The National Honor Society is a Community Service Organization. All students are required to maintain a GPA of 91 or above and complete both In-School and Out - of - School Community Service in order to maintain membership.

10th & 11th grade students receive an invitation to apply mid-year based on GPA. The induction ceremony for new members takes place in October and the Cording Ceremony for 12th Grade students in good standing takes place during May.

Science Honor Society: Ms. Goldberg The Science National Honor Society is an organization designed for the serious science student. Participants are selected for membership, and must have a 90 average in their science classes. Each member will have taken honors or AP science classes, and are required to take at least one AP science class. The students who are involved with the Science National Honor Society are those students who are seriously considering a career in the scientific field, and are strongly looking at science as a college major. By participating in the Science National Honor Society, students will attend scientific lectures, mentor their peers, tutors those in need of additional help, and organize events for scientific inquiry. Students will also have the opportunity to research different scientific fields to help them choose a career path that is best suited for them.

Social Studies Honor Society: Ms. McGuinness_RHO KAPPA Social Studies Honor Society is a national organization for high school juniors and seniors that recognize excellence in the field of Social Studies. The mission and purpose of this organization is to promote scholarship and to recognize academic excellence in social studies in secondary school environments and the community, and to encourage interest in, understanding of, and appreciation for the social studies. To become a member, the student must have been in attendance at Comsewogue High School for one semester prior to being considered, must have completed two core courses in the field of social studies and be prepared to complete at least three core courses. The minimum GPA for these courses is an unweighted 3.00 or the numerical equivalent. The student must also have an overall cumulative GPA of 3.00.

Spanish Honor Society: Ms. Trypaluk The honor society is involved in community service activities such as food and clothing drives. The society also provides tutoring in Spanish for those students in need of assistance. Fundraising allows the society to enjoy holiday parties, welcoming or farewell parties for our exchange students and field trips to museums, theater productions and restaurants. Students who wish to become a member of the Spanish Honor Society must have a cumulative average of at least 90 in Spanish and must have attended meetings and participated in various activities from the beginning of that school year prior to applying for membership in March.

Tri-M (Music Honor Society): Ms. Holmes Tri-M (Modern Music Masters) is the National Honor Society of Music. Students who are currently enrolled in a music ensemble may apply to become an apprentice. When the requirements of apprenticeship are completed, the student will be included into the society. Tri-M is a service organization, which assists in cultural endeavors in the Comsewogue community. In the past, this group has assisted at community events, high school plays and musicals, J.F.K. Middle School productions and various concerts throughout the district. Information about meetings and activities may be obtained from the bulletin board in the music wing.
