



# Comsewogue HS Class and Club Handbook 2020-2021



**The Academic Club: Ms. McGuinness**

If you're good at Trivial Pursuit or just have a lot of knowledge, this club may be for you! Comsewogue High School competes in the Regional Quiz Bowl Tournaments at Port Jefferson High School and in MSG Varsity and Channel 12's The Challenge.

Quiz Bowl is a competitive, academic, interscholastic activity for which players attend periodic practices and then represent their school at varsity tournaments. Quiz bowl questions range over the entire spectrum of a high school curriculum and also include a certain amount of current events, sports, and popular culture. The matches feature a blend of individual competition and team collaboration, since no individual player is likely to be an expert in all subject areas. (Adapted from NAQT High School Quiz Bowl.)

**The Art Club: Ms. Coffman**

Athletes Helping Athletes is a selective club in which varsity athletes will be trained as facilitators, by current and former professional athletes, to engage young people and work with them in our community. Through this process they will help younger students examine personal and group behaviors, and discuss issues and choices that exist in their lives such as healthy life decisions, bullying and drug/alcohol prevention. As leaders they will model positive behaviors and decisions necessary for success not only in athletics but in life as well.

**B.U.T.Y. (Bring Unity to Youth): Ms. Kinane**

The BUTY Program was first started in 1989. The goal is to foster mutual respect and understanding among all groups regardless of race, creed, color or national origin. We also strive to enforce character building traits within the school population and community. Activities have included school-wide "contests" to encourage respect and kindness between all members of the school, surveys to show how similar we all are, field trips to become involved in Unity Day, and the like. We also participate in fundraisers for organizations such as Ride for Life. Club member's input determines many of our yearly projects and the focus of our projects. This is a service organization that will be an asset on your college resume.

### **Comsewogue Connections Club: Ms. Palin**

The Comsewogue Connections Club aims to assist English as a New Language learner's transition into American culture and the New York Educational System and to bridge cultural divides by educating students, forming mentor/mentee relationships, and providing a forum for community outreach. All students who are interested in fostering an understanding and inclusive culture in Comsewogue, in fighting discrimination in general, and who would like to make a lasting impact on others that will be mutually beneficial should sign up for this club.

- Students will speak English and Spanish and will improve both communication and team building skills.
- Students will broaden their own knowledge of the world as a result of having direct access to different cultures.
- Students will have the opportunity to teach, tutor, and mentor--all roles which shape leaders.

### **Drama Club: Ms. Johnson**

Comsewogue High School's Drama Club is responsible for putting on the school's theatrical productions. From the yearly musical to the fall and spring dramas, there are plenty of opportunities to be involved in the dramatic arts. Learn about acting, lighting, sound, song, and stage direction. Experience the thrill of live performance and the challenge of putting a quality show together.

### **English Honor Society: Ms. O'Hara**

The English Honor Society is dedicated to promoting love of reading and writing, and specifically focusing on these in our own community. One of our most successful programs is Reading Partners, where students work directly with elementary teachers after school, helping young students improve their reading and writing skills. We also do an annual reading assembly for kindergartners, as well as participate in many community-driven school events, like trick-or-treat street, carnivals, and the winter wonderland. All members must complete 20 hours of service and participate in at least 2 fundraisers by graduation. All students interested must have two years of unweighted 93 or better in English, and have an overall unweighted average of 85 or better. Applications are due by May 1 of the student's sophomore or junior year.

### **E-Sports: Mr. Wessel**

Comsewogue's newly created eSports Club promotes strategy, teamwork and communication skills. Once established, our students would compete with other local, regional and national teams in various games. Practices and Skirmishes can take place in the school or remotely depending on the time and the game. Recently, colleges have begun offering scholarships to attract eSports students to attend their college and join their teams.

Esports (also known as electronic sports, e-sports, or eSports) is a form of competition using video games. Most commonly, esports takes the form of organized, multiplayer video game competitions, particularly between professional players and teams. Although organized online and offline competitions have long been a part of video game culture, these were largely between amateurs until the late 2000s, when participation by professional gamers and spectatorship in these events through live streaming saw a large surge in popularity. By the 2010s, esports was a significant factor in the video game industry, with many game developers actively designing toward a professional esports subculture. The most common video game genres associated with esports are real-time strategy (RTS), first-person shooter (FPS), fighting and multiplayer online battle arena (MOBA). Popular games for esports include League of Legends, Dota 2, Counter-Strike: Global Offensive, Call of Duty, Hearthstone, Overwatch, Tom Clancy's Rainbow Six Siege, PlayerUnknown's Battlegrounds, Fortnite Battle Royale, and StarCraft II. Tournaments such as the League of Legends World Championship, Dota 2's The International, the fighting games-specific Evolution Championship Series, and the Intel Extreme Masters provide live broadcasts of the competition and prize money to competitors.

### **FIDM Fashion Club: Ms. Melton**

This is an international high school fashion program sponsored by FIDM, Fashion Institute of Design and Merchandising, a prestigious fashion college with four campuses located in California's fashion and entertainment centers. This club is dedicated to helping students interested in pursuing careers in fashion, fashion merchandising/marketing and all other areas of this fast growing industry. Participants will work on creating work for portfolios and gaining experience for a career in the fashion industry. Club Presidents lead activities at their meetings, organize events, and do fundraisers. Perhaps the biggest advantage to FIDM's Fashion Club is that the President and members qualify for exclusive scholarships to attend FIDM, between \$4,000 and \$24,000, plus they get access to special contests and giveaways. This is a great opportunity for students serious about a career in Fashion.

**French Honor Society: Ms. Daneels**

The French Club/French Honor Society participates in many different activities throughout the year. Our focus is to expand cultural awareness through participation in different holiday celebrations such as Mardi Gras, Candlemas and le Poisson d'Avril. Each year we plan a different cultural trip such as Broadway shows, visiting museums and eating at authentic French restaurants. In addition, we actively participate in community service projects.

**Girl's Leader Club: Ms. O'Hara**

This club is a great way for girls to participate in and plan important school/community activities. Activities include collecting for our Food Drive, planning and running Trick-or-Treat Street, Holiday Gift Shopping and donations, planning and participation of our annual Senior Citizens Prom, and participation in all school/community events. In the recent past, we have also helped families in need by providing meals and necessities, participated in major fundraisers such as Relay for Life and Ride for Life, and participated in the Community Carnival. Students in all grades are welcome.

**Greenagers: Ms. Coffman**

The Greenagers Club will work within the school and community to promote environmentally friendly practices. Club members will become familiar with current environmental issues and learn ways in which to become more "green" in everyday life.

**Italian Honor Society: Mr. Drucker**

The Italian Honor Society is involved in community service activities such as food and clothing drives. The society also provides tutoring in Italian for those students in need of assistance. Fundraising allows the society to enjoy holiday parties, welcoming and farewell parties for our exchange students, and field trips to museums, theater productions, and restaurants. Students who wish to become members of the Italian Honor Society must have a cumulative average of at least 90 in Italian and must have attended meetings and participated in various activities from the beginning of that year prior to applying for membership in March.

**Law Club: Mr. Schauss**

The Comsewogue Law Club participates in the New York State Bar Association Mock Trial Tournament. If you're thinking of being a lawyer or love watching episodes of Law and Order and can picture yourself saying "Objection!" this club may be for you. The mock trial program teaches high school students basic trial practice skills. Students learn how to conduct direct and cross-examinations, how to present opening and closing statements, how to think on their feet and learn the dynamics of a courtroom. Students will also learn how to analyze legal issues and apply the law to the facts of the case.

Additionally, Mock Trial teaches professionalism. Students learn ethics, civility and how to be zealous but courteous advocates for their clients. Good sportsmanship and respect for all participants are central to this competition. (Adapted from NYS Mock trial tournament materials.)
